

LIVINGSTON COUNTY BOARD  
SHERIFF, JAIL & LICENSE COMMITTEE  
MINUTES OF SEPTEMBER 2, 2014

Committee Chair Carl Borngasser called the meeting to order at 5:00 p.m. in the committee room within the Livingston County Historic Courthouse.

Borngasser called called for any additions or changes to the agenda with none being requested. *Motion by Yoder, second by Weller to approve the agenda as presented. MOTION CARRIED WITH ALL AYES.*

The Committee reviewed minutes of the August 8, 2014 meeting. *Motion by Kestner, second by Peterson to approve the minutes of the August 8, 2014 meeting as presented. MOTION CARRIED WITH ALL AYES.*

**Monthly Department Report**– Cox reported an average daily jail population of 99, with 16 being the average number of days spent. Cox reported that there are currently 80 out of county detainees including 20 females from Cook County, 50 males from Cook County and 10 federal inmates. Cox reported they current population at 120.

**Cook County Report** - Superintendent Cox reported a federal billing of \$17,050, totaling \$124,850 year to date. Cox reported a Cook County billing of \$79,900 for the month of August, totaling \$614,450 year to date.

**FY 2015 Budget** – The Committee discussed the draft FY 2015 budgets. Salary line items have not been included since contract negotiations have not been completed. Slagel stated that the non-salary items for the jail total \$643,920 and \$553,685 for the sheriff’s budget. Slagel reported the totals for 2014 non-salary items were 495,458 for the sheriff’s budget and 584,737 for the jail for a total of \$1,080,195. Sheriff Lindsey noted that the animal control budget has been adjusted to \$234,000. The Committee will continue to review and discuss at next month’s meeting.

**Animal Control** – N/A

**LJC Fencing & Electronic Locking** – Superintendent Cox reviewed proposals for security upgrades at the Law & Justice Center. The first proposal is to add a security fence along the back side of the building at a cost of \$98,169. The second proposal is to add card access points to the elevators and back entrances at a cost of \$27,245. Discussion took place. Consensus of the Committee was to continue discussion at next month’s meeting.

**Raffle Licenses** – The Committee reviewed an application for a Class B raffle license submitted by the Livingston County Democratic Party. *Motion by Yoder, second by Arbogast to approve a Class B raffle license for the Livingston County Democratic Party.* **MOTION CARRIED WITH ALL AYES.**

The Committee reviewed the bills presented. *Motion by Kestner, second by Weller to approve the bills.* **MOTION CARRIED WITH ALL AYES.**

*Motion by Arbogast, second by Kestner to adjourn.* **MOTION CARRIED WITH ALL AYES.**
