LETTER OF SUPPORT FOR WECS PROJECT DEVELOPMENT

Dear Livingston County Board and Livingston County Zoning Board of Appeals:

On April 20, 2022, the School Board (the “Board”) for Tri-Point Community Unit School District No. 6J (the “District”) passed Resolution 2022-3 proclaiming the District’s support for the development and construction of a wind energy conversion system (“WECS”) project by Livingston Wind Project, LLC and its affiliates and assigns (collectively, “Developer”) in Livingston County, Sullivan, Broughton, Round Grove, and Union Townships (the “Project”), and within a one and a half (1 ½) mile radius from the District’s property line, including but not limited to the development and construction of WECS towers, pursuant to Livingston County Code of Ordinances Part II, Chapter 56, Article VIII. The Board acknowledges the many benefits of the Project, including renewable energy, payments to participating property owners in the community, tax revenues to the District that will enhance the District’s resources and provide more opportunities to the District’s students and staff, potential job growth at the District and in the community, and direct and indirect economic benefits of a significant financial investment in the area by the Project.

Further by Resolution 2022- 3, the District waives the setbacks requirements for the development and construction of the Project, or any part thereof, including but not limited to WECS towers within one and a half (1 ½) miles from the District’s property line pursuant to Livingston County Code of Ordinances Part II, Chapter 56, Article VIII, § 56-618(h)(8).
