



PAYMENT FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

<p>How do I find out how much I owe?</p>	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Go to www.judici.com and look up your case by name or case number. 2. Stop by the Livingston County Circuit Clerk’s Office and request a printout of your balance. 3. Call the Livingston County Circuit Clerk’s Office at (815) 844-2602.
<p>How do I make payments?</p>	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Pay in person at the Livingston County Circuit Clerk’s Office. 2. Pay online at www.judici.com. 3. Pay by mail by mailing your payment to the Livingston County Circuit Clerk’s Office at the address below.
<p>What will happen if I don’t pay my balance by the due date?</p>	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. If you are on court supervision for a <u>petty traffic</u> offense (“TR” case number) with no other special conditions other than money owed, your court supervision will be revoked and a conviction will enter for the offense to which you were sentenced. 2. If you are on court supervision, conditional discharge, or probation for a <u>major traffic/misdemeanor</u> offense (“MT” or “CM” case number), the State’s Attorney’s Office could file a Petition to Revoke or a Contempt petition, in which case you would be summoned to appear in court for further proceedings. If you fail to appear in court as directed, a warrant could be issued for your arrest. 3. Your unpaid balance could also be sent to a collection agency.
<p>What should I do if I need more time to pay (or to complete any part of my sentence)?</p>	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. <u>Prior to your due date</u>, you may file a written motion in your case requesting that the court allow an extension of your due date. A form for this motion may be obtained from the Livingston County Circuit Clerk’s Office at no cost to you. 2. Once you file that motion for extension, you must obtain a hearing date to appear before the judge and explain the reason for your extension request. 3. At the hearing, the judge will consider all relevant factors including whether you have made good faith efforts to pay what you owe as well as whether you have completed other aspects of your sentence (such as community service work or evaluations and treatment, if ordered in your case).
