

LIVINGSTON COUNTY BOARD

MINUTES OF JULY 1, 2024

Committee Chair Jack Vietti called the meeting to order at 4:06 p.m. in the Committee Room of the Historic Courthouse.

There was no quorum present for the meeting. A discussion was held for the purpose of relaying information only.

Appointment: Livingston County Board of Review – Sue Swartz:

Renken reported that a current member, James Patten, is stepping down and they are looking to appoint Sue Swartz to fill the role. Renken stated that Swartz is a Republican, former Township Assessor and has financial experience due to working at the Bank of Pontiac for many years.

Certification of Election Judges:

Masching reported that both the republican and democrat representatives had met to review the list of election judges. Masching stated that once approved by the committee and full board, they will be forwarded to the courts for approval.

Intergovernmental Agreement: McLean County / Show Bus – 5311 Grant:

Hartley reported that in 1996, Livingston County entered into an Intergovernmental Agreement with neighboring counties to become eligible for the 5311 grants, which provide funding for public transportation including capital, planning and operating assistance. Hartley reported that McLean County served as the Grantee on behalf of the region. Hartley stated that McLean County has provided notice that effective June 30, 2025, they will no longer be participating in the region or working with Show Bus as the transportation provider. Hartley stated that there are several issues that need to be resolved as the County works to determine how best to move forward. Hartley noted that it is likely that Chairman Carley will appoint an advisory group to work on possible solutions.
